Both organizations take the glasses and sort, clean, and confirm prescription before shipping to places where they are needed. As of March 2020, CLERC has shipped 5,548,028 pairs of glasses.

Reading, Single Vision, Bifocal, Children's, Safety, prescription and non-prescription Sunglasses, new and used, are collected. Plastic and metal framed glasses as well as lenses not in frames can be shipped if they are not broken.

Rather than storing the glasses for a long time, send as soon as possible. Time, extreme temperatures, and weather conditions cause damage to frames and lenses, often rendering them useless.

Pack eyeglasses in a sturdy corrugated box. Layer rows of eyeglasses with tissue paper, or newspaper. Please avoid shredded packing materials or "Styrofoam peanuts". Seal the boxes with tape, be sure the label is legible, and include your return address. Shipping labels can be found on the above noted websites.
