I wish to utilise this space to remind fellow Lions of important aspects of Lions Service which require our attention before this Lions year comes to an end:

Club Membership Plans. It is good practice for an organization to set a goal; and then outline a plan for achieving that goal. Each clubs in A15 is encouraged to prepare a membership plan for the year and submit it to GMT Membership and Club Growth Leader, PDG Larry Wainwright, before our District Convention. Each District Chair is also encouraged to prepare and submit a synopsis of his/her plan for the year.

Club Officers. Each clubs is reminded to appoint a nomination committee to ensure a new club executive is elected by April 2013, and Form PU- 101 is sent to LCI Headquarters by the end of May.

World of Service Awards: LCI is now accepting nominations for I.P Wayne Madden's World of Service Award. This award recognizes people (Lions and others) who are exemplary in service to the world in any of the these categories: the best Reading Action Program RAP Video, Fighting Hunger, Literacy work, Engaging the youth, service to the visually Impaired and protection of our environment. Nominations must be received at LCI Headquarters by March 1, 2013. The awards will be presented during LCI annual Convention in Hamburg, Germany.

Club Excellence Process (CEP). Gives each club an opportunity to assess club governance and activities, take stock of membership growth and to find out which club activities are good and those that are not so good and making plans for self-improvement. Contact GMT for more information.
