Challenge:

Match lawsuit settlement for Dog Guides program

A number of clubs throughout the District will be receiving, or may have already received, a \$50 check as a result of a Class Action Law Suit involving price fixing in chocolate products used in a variety of fund raising campaigns.

At the District Convention, International Director Yves Leveille issued a challenge to all such clubs to donate that amount along with a matching club donation to a total of \$100 to the Lions Foundation of Canada Dog Guide Program. Such a donation would permit the club to honour a member with a Life Membership in the Lions Foundation of Canada and provide an opportunity to support Canadians with a variety of disabilities.

Clubs choosing to do so, may deal directly with the Foundation or, if you wish, checks may be sent to Cabinet Treasurer Peter Oswald who will then forward the collected funds with a single payment from the District.






