

LION BRUCE MURRAY

Murray passed away peacefully at Victoria Hospital, London, Ontario on Wednesday, April 5, 2017 at the age of 84. Past Director Murray, a member of St. Marys Lions Club (A15), served a two-year term as a Director of the International Association of Lions Clubs after his election at the Association's 64th Convention held in Phoenix, Arizona in 1981.

A Lion since 1965, Past Director Murray held numerous positions in Lions, including Club President, Zone Chairman, Deputy District Governor and District Governor. He was Vice Chair of Multiple District 'A'

Council of Governors and Promotional Chair for MD "A".

Bruce received seven Extension Awards, the 100% District Governor Award, fourteen District Governor's Appreciation Awards, five International President's Awards and was a Key Member. He was a recipient of the Ambassador of Good Will Award, the highest honour the Association gives to its members.

Past Director Murray founded Canada's first International Youth Exchange Camp and served for six years as its Director. He is a founder of the Lions Foundation of Canada and until recently served as Chairperson of the Board of Directors for Lions Quest Canada.

He is survived by his wife Lion Janis and their family. At the start of this Lions year, Bruce and Janis had transferred membership to The West Coast Lions Club. He remained an Associate Member to the club he had supported for 51 years, the St Marys Lion Club

"A Local Tribute to a Great Lion"

Bruce Murray of Grand Bend and formerly of St. Marys passed away April 5, 2017. He left a large imprint in our town, purchasing M&M Variety- (Murray & McClelland) where customers were greeted by a friendly Mynah Bird.

Later he ran a restaurant called the Broken Spoke in the late 60's and went on to auctioneering and later the Insurance Business.

A Lions club member since 1965, his accomplishments in Lionism are reported on page #2 of this newsletter.

As one mentored by PID Bruce, Past District Governor Karen McNeight tells a the story in her own words: I first saw Bruce in the summer of 1990, and witnessed him as the Auctioneer, and remember marvelling at his ability to crack a joke midway through the bidding wars, and then carry on, only to throw out another quip at a friend's expense a moment later, and then carry on. He wasn't just an Auctioneer, he was an Entertainer, and he was enjoying every minute.

Little did I know then, that 10 years later I would have the privilege of becoming his friend through something called Lions, and that, he, together with his longtime friend Jim Loucks, would walk me through a Lion's journey on my way to be Governor, during which time I would become well acquainted with the preface; "You need to know that..." at the beginning of almost every conversation. I learned that he was a force to be reckoned with as he quite literally cleared the path so that the St. Marys Lions Club could have another Governor. Our Club was lucky that way, for as a result of his position as International Director, he bragged about our Club, and about our Town, everywhere he went in the world. He was our Ambassador never failing to bring home an idea for a new project or activity.

He could see what was possible, and I think it often frustrated him when we couldn't envision what he could see. But we did grab hold of one project he brought home, and have been doing it for over twelvey ears now. That project was the placing of flags at downtown businesses on holidays and special occasions or events in an effort to be proudly patriotic, similar to our American neighbour. And this past weekend the downtown businesses are all flying our bright, new, red and white Canadian Fags in honour of Vimy Ridge. I would like to think that they were waving for Bruce as well. I know he'd be proud of us for braving the wet, cold, snow of Thursday night to put them up.

Downtown St. Marys looks very impressive and patriotic and if you have time you should drive down the hill and into Town and maybe see a glimpse of Bruce's vision. Bruce was always trying to inspire our Club to go big and be fearless, because he himself was big and fearless. He lived life with such intensity. He was passionate about Lions, he was passionate about Family, he was passionate about making a

difference. His age didn't lesson that, his body might have failed him, but his brain was still on the edge of a new dream. If he believed in you, you were the luckiest person in the world, and you suddenly wanted to be the best you could be. You wanted to make him proud.

It wasn't that Bruce was a soft, gentle soul, although he had his moments, Bruce in fact, could be bold, sometimes he was brash, and at times even a little



overbearing. But he lived intensely. He was fiery and emotional. He loved deeply, but he could be wounded deeply too. He could inspire you, and he could incense you. But as much as he pushed you, he pushed himself. He never seemed to stop trying to prove himself.

He was just such a large, distinguished, presence. He commanded attention; and I will miss him. I will miss looking across the Lions table and catching that twinkle in his eye, and bursting into laughter at something we both found amusing. I will miss his ability to make me want to be better, to do better, and to be all I can be. I want to thank Janis and his family for sharing Bruce with the St. Marys Lions Club, and with the world of Lions, really. We are grateful, and Lions are bigger and better for it.

And finally, for my own part, I believe Bruce was able to stand before God early Wednesday morning and say;

"I don't have a single drop of talent left, I used everything you gave me." I guess Bruce has left us with one more thing to aspire to!

Galt-Cambridge Lions Honour Lion Don Gamble

The Lions Club of Galt-Cambridge have renamed their hall in honour of Lion Don who has quite a history in Lionism. He moved from Granby, Quebec thirty-five years ago and transferred to the Galt-Cambridge Lions. They had just moved into their

new home on Ainslie Street. Lion Don was elected 3rd Vice in 1983-84 and Treasurer in 1984-85. He held that position until 1995-96. After being involved in several other club activities he returned as Treasurer in 2007-08, working in that office and that of Assistant Treasurer to the end of 2015-16. Coincidentally Don turned ninety-one years young on March 5th of this year. His career in Lions started with the Granby Lions in 1952, he was District Governor in District A8 in Quebec in 1964-65.



For years Bingo was a major fund-raiser for the club and Lion Don was involved with all phases. While involved it was a a weekly and/or a bi-weekly commitment every year. A great deal of City Hall contacts were established to assist in making the process flow smoothly along with organizing the bingo teams. Substantial funds were raised to benefit community organizations. There were many other Lions events going on and Don has always done his best to participate in them. He was involved in the early days of the Lions Eye Screening Program, responsible for assembling teams to cover visits to schools for testing, the program now includes hearing as well. Many hours were accumulated because of Don's efforts and of course those of the club members.

Lion Don has been Host Chair of four District A-15 Conventions. He was District A-15 Treasurer for a year as well. He has attended almost all A-15 Conventions since 1985, a minimum of twenty-two MD-A Conventions and eight International Conventions also.

Over the years, sixty-five of them, Don's wife, Lion Charlotte has been the consummate supporter, assisting with the reams of paper work. A true "Partner in Service." Lookingafter the registration details for four A-15 District Conventions. She worked over one hundred of the club bingos and has participated in fifteen Cancer Relays for Life that raised upwards of \$30,000.00.

Lion Don can't believe he is receiving this honour, he states "It would not be possible if was not for all the work that the members of the Galt Cambridge Lions Club have done over the years. They are all members of a great team that make it

possible for us to serve our community and human kind, living the Lions Motto.

28TH ANNUAL CONSERVATION DINNER



The dinner, a gala charitable auction fund-raiser of the Exeter Lions Club and Ausable Bayfield Conservation Foundation included live & silent auctions, raffles and an ice sculpture toast to Canada's 150th anniversary courtesy of Iceculture Inc. of Hensall, the feature artist

at the 28th Dinner held on April 6, 2017 at South Huron Recreation Centre in Exeter. Featured was a fourteen foot wide ice sculpture with a Canadian 150th anniversary theme, from IceCulture Inc. Auction items included a VIA Rail Canada Round Trip London to Halifax for two courtesy of VIA Rail and feature packages from Iceculture in Hensall and Chill Ice House in Toronto. Four hundred people attended another sold-out show, and organizers estimate close to \$60,000 was raised for community conservation projects.

South Huron District High School students sang O Canada. Ben Lobb, MPP for Huron-Bruce, was one of four volunteer auctioneers at the charity event and also made a toast to Canada to begin the evening. The guests toasted the 150th anniversary of Canadian Confederation with Ontario wine, from Dark Horse Estate Winery Inc., in shot glasses made of ice, courtesy of Iceculture. Exeter Lions Club President Craig Hebert noted that Lions Clubs International is celebrating its 100th anniversary in 2017. The Exeter Lions Club is celebrating its 80th anniversary of community service..

The Conservation Dinner has raised over \$1.1 million over its twenty-eight year history for projects in the watershed community since 1990.

Proud olympian and accomplished athlete and volunteer, Mandy Bujold will be recognized as the 60th K-W Citizen of the Year.

"What an incredible privilege to be the recipient of such a long-standing and respected award," shares Mandy. "This community has supported me throughout my career, I can't think of a better honour."







Known for courage, strength and determination, she is a model for exceptional citizenship by volunteering for the KW Art Gallery and "Screw Cancer" initiative and an advocate for Canadian Tire's Jumpstart program and as a member of the Canada Games 2021 Committee with its bid to host the Games in K-W.

As one of the most decorated female boxers in Canada, Mandy has won ten National Championships and is the first female boxer to win two gold medals at the Pan-Am Games. Representing Canada and her hometown of K-W at the 2016 Summer Olympic Games in Rio, Brazil, Mandy's incredible determination was demonstrated when she competed despite battling a virus that

resulted in hospitalization.

Last year she received the Woman of the Year, Sports and Recreation Award through Oktoberfest and was nominated for a WowtheWorld – Waterloo Region award. She has been named Waterloo Region's Athlete of the Year twice. She is an ambassador for Fast and Female – a not-for-profit organization dedicated to empowering young women through sport.

"Mandy has accomplished so much we are pleased to recognize her accomplishments," shares Dr. Jack Bishop, Citizen of the Year Committee Chair. "Once again, the Lions Club of Kitchener is pleased to pay tribute to this outstanding community champion."

In 1957, the first KW Citizen of the Year Award was presented. Identifying a resident from the K-W area to receive this honour. It was carried out by the Twin City Jaycees for another 49 years. In 2007 the Lions Club of Kitchener continued the tradition.
