

Dr. Daphne Maurer from McMaster University spoke on how important it is to keep this program going in our schools.

Lion Richard Green organizes the Monday and Tuesday screening programs. Along with other members and wives of the Galt- Cambridge Lions, we all give our time willingly for the welfare of the young JK and SK children. It is a happy morning! The children make you smile! We are alerting their parents for any early vision and hearing problems. It is then up to the parents to get their children to an Optometrist.

Students screened for Vision for 2015-2016 is 1521 with 265 referred = 17% Students screened for Hearing for 2015-2016 is 1566 with 120 referred = 8%

GIFT OF LIFE



April is Organ and Tissue Donation Awareness month. It is the single most important time of the year for raising awareness of the need for organ and tissue needs among the public.

Lions in MDA have partnered with Trillium Gift of Life Network to promote registrations for potential donors in Ontario. As part of the campaign to raise awareness, MDA and Trillium are seeking to raise the BeADonor flag in as many communities across Ontario as possible. While the goal is 100 per cent involvement, that may not

be realistic, but every effort will be made.

Flags will be distributed to to clubs in Region 9 and Region 51. Grand Bend and Bayfield clubs which will receive a delivery of Gift of Life materials and will a flag delivered from Trillium. Attempts to get other flags to Region 37 during the lead up to April will be completed. All clubs are encouraged to approach your local councils, or seek permission to raise the flag within their village and towns if they are a part of a larger municipality.

For Trillium to coordinate the flag raisings across the province and to avoid conflicts with other advocate groups who may be seeking the same flag raisings, Trillium needs names, addresses, communities and contact details. When flags are distributed the available information will be collected and sent on to Trillium. If there are any questions contact Lion Bob Rutter, Coordinator at giftoflife@a15lions.org.


DRUMBO LIONS




The Blazing Fiddles — Je Taylor, Brielle Goheen, Adam Poot, Chris Kettlewell
