



# In Memoriam Past International Director Ernie Moore

#### "He Served"



Past International Director Ernie Moore passed away peacefully with his family by his side, in hospital, Perth, Ontario, on Sunday, May 21, 2017. Ernie Moore, in his 88th year, was the beloved and cherished husband of Julie (nee Malloy) of Perth and a wonderful and loving father to Nancy (Ken) Chapman of Brampton, Linda (Brett) Martin of Red Deer, Alberta and Ernie (Mary Jane) of Newmarket. Ernie was employed with the Ontario government for over 34 years and retired in April, 1989. Horace H. "Ernie" Moore served a two year term as a Director of the International Association

of Lions Clubs after his election at the Association's 68th annual Convention held in Dallas, Texas, June, 1985. A Lion since 1953, Past Director Moore held the office of Charter Club President, District Governor, Council Chairman and Treasurer of the Lions Foundation of Canada. He served as an appointee to the International Board of Directors in 1987-88.

In recognition of his contributions to the Association, Past Director Moore received a 100% District Governor Award, six International President Awards, three Extension Awards and six International President's Certificate of Appreciation Awards. He was a Life Member of Lions Clubs International, a two time recipient of the Key Member Award and recipient of the Ambassador of Good Will Award, the highest honour granted to a member by the Association. He was a Melvin Jones Fellow.

## **BRIDGEPORT LIONS**

#### **DESTINY'S JOURNEY – HELP NEEDED!**

Destiny is a 17-year-old high school graduate from Cambridge who wishes to attend college but cannot due to ongoing medical treatments needed this year.

#### What Happened:

- In December 2014, Destiny was cheerleading and got struck in the face by a flyer. A "flyer" is someone being thrown into the air.
- This minor trauma triggered a Giant Cell Granuloma which was categorized as "aggressive" and developed a tumour (the size of orange).
- This tumour was detected in jaw, teeth, tongue and sinus area.



#### **Medical Treatment:**

- Exploratory surgery was completed in January 2015. Samples determined that this was not cancer but a non-malignant growth needing immediate attention.
- Extraction surgery was completed in May 2015 (17 hour duration) involving removal of left side of mouth, lower jaw, teeth, and tissue. The jaw was replaced with bone from leg and a titanium insert (187 stitches).
- The picture taken after the surgeries illustrate the "expertise" of the Doctors involved. Limited external changes, extensive internal changes and more work required which must happen now.

#### **Current Status:**

Treatment was successful but reconstruction of teeth and face area is required. This work must happen this year as soon as possible. College has to wait for now.

#### **Funding Problem (\$\$):**

- Teeth reconstruction is not covered by OHIP or father's benefit plan; OHIP considers this work cosmetic.
- Local MP has approached Government for \$\$ help but was declined multiple times.
- Thames Valley (TV) is providing a \$30,000 grant to pay ¼ of ongoing costs (each event) up to \$30,000.
- Doctors were convinced this would be covered but the reality was "No".

#### Funding Needs (\$\$):

- It is estimated that upwards of \$70,000 will be required in 2017. Parents cannot afford this.
- \$30,000 has been granted by Thames Valley.
- Minimum \$40,000 still required. The specialized teeth implants are at a minimum \$5000 apiece; 7 to 8 are implants will be required.
