SEVERAL QUERIES RECEIVED BY CLUBS

Caution urged on "spam" email requests for funds

Lions:

As Lions we receive from time to time requests for support from individuals and organizations. Be aware that where Lions through the International organization, the Multiple District or District have endorsed the request a very clear statement of that endorsement is always made.

The absence of such an endorsement does not in and of itself mean that the request is illegitimate. HOWEVER you are strongly urged to exercise due diligence when deciding as a club or as an individual how you wish to proceed.

In the past couple of days a specific example of such a request has been received by a number of clubs. The email comes from a Kenneth Springer and requests your support of something called the Hueyify Project. Several people have brought the email to our attention and sought advice on how to respond. We cannot make that decision for you but offer the following commentary.

At first glance the request may seem legitimate however closer examination by myself and IT Chair Ted has raised the following red flags as examples of the kinds of things you need be aware of when evaluating such requests.

The domain name for the "organization" is registered in Australia.

The phone number is not North American and the registrant is from New Zealand.

It is not a charitable operation. You have to read through a FAQ on their website to learn this. Nothing is stated in this regard in the email but one could argue that it is

implied.

This appears to be a request for you to fund product development out of the "goodness of your heart" rather than through a legitimate investment opportunity. There is no guarantee that such a product will ever be produced of that it will accomplish the stated goals. It seeks to raise capital for the further development of a software that will make the use of the internet easier for the blind and the autistic. The manner in which this will be done is more philosophical in nature then specific.

The concept statement makes undemonstrated claims; there is no proof of concept and there are no working samples of application. We did not find mention of support from a broader base of recognizable organizations working on behalf of the blind or the autistic.

If they are legitimate, we find it odd that they have not approached and/or received the support of existing charitable organizations who provide services etc to the blind or autistic. Why seek help from the bottom levels of large organizations such as the Lions rather than from the top levels of the organization? On an emotional level it sounds good but from a verifiable fact basis we find little to trust in the statements being made.

As stated earlier, always exercise due diligence when evaluating such requests.

District Governor Lion Tim is aware of and supports this commentary.

Cambridge Highlands lauded by newspaper

What a mixture – lions, women and dogs. It was a joyful time when the Highland Lions Club of Cambridge handed out money to further the Guide Dog program in Canada and to assist Haven House, a Cambridge shelter for women.

Last week at a dinner meeting at St. James Anglican Church in Hespeler, members of the Highlands Lions Club showed their generosity and their caring for the community when they presented a cheque for \$2,136 to Haven House.

Representing Haven House was Merle Fast. She thanked the club for its timely donation, as the shelter has launched a new building fund program to establish a new and larger centre at 70 Acorn Way.

"The present location of our shelter for abused women is located on Concession Road," said Fast, "and (it) simply cannot accommodate the number of women and their children who need emergency help."

Haven House takes care of food, housing and counselling for those women who stay at the facility. Help is also given to women who remain at home or return home from Haven House.

"Every abused woman deserves a shelter and a better

life," she said.

The Lions Club was told three therapy dogs are available at the shelter to assist women and children.

To build the new shelter, \$6 million is needed.

The Lions Club did not forget those wonderfully clever Guide Dogs bred and trained by the Lions

Foundation of Canada. The breeding facilities are just outside Cambridge near Breslau.

Representing the foundation was (RC 51 Lion) Charlene Teasdale of Guelph who accepted a \$12,000 cheque from Highlands past-president (Lion) Margaret DeBoer.

"I am so thankful that during my term as president we raised the money for such a gtreat cause as the Guide Dog program," said DeBoer.

Guide Dogs are trained in six programs: vision, hearing, special skills, seizure response, autism assistance and diabetes alert.
