









COPETOWN LIONS

ot only is Canada's Outdoor Farm Show important to farmers and agricultural businesses, It's a strong community booster thanks to volunteers from area Lions Clubs. Larry Taylor, with the Thamesford Lions, has been involved from day one. "We do business in excess of \$150,000. Last year the Lions Clubs' contribution to the total show was 3,500 volunteer hours", he said. The clubs involved two based in Woodstock and clubs in Thamesford, New Hamburg, Ingersoll, Hickson, Drumbo, Innkerkip, Sweaburg, Ayr and Plattsville. "Everyone contributes. We couldn't do it without any one of those clubs." Profits from the volunteer efforts go back into the communities surrounding the show site in Woodstock.

Participating Lions Club are all part of the team. "In Thamesford, we support most groups that comes to us, hockey, baseball, scouts, girl guides, the Santa Claus parade and others," Taylor said. He has been doing this for twenty years and was one of the originals. All the Lions and volunteers enjoy doing this for the communities involved.






WATERLOO LIONS




