1. Meeting was called to order by the District Governor.
2. Protocol was set by 1st VDG Tony Davidson.
3. Lion Jim Keron reviewed the Zoom etiquette for the meeting.
4. The District Governor asked everyone to stand for the playing of O'Canada.
5. The District Governor asked while everyone was still standing for moment to respect those Lions who have passed before us and to say a special prayer and for those Lions who are experiencing health challenges and for their families.
6. The District Governor stated his appreciation to IPDG Art Woods for performing the Induction Ceremony with a high level of respect and dignity. The ceremony spotlighted IPDG Art with each cabinet group of Zone Chairs and Region Chairs then each individual starting with the CT, CS, 2ndVDG, 1stVDG and finally the DG. As the 2ndVDG is on vacation his role and duties were noted by IPDG.
7. Additions to and Approval of the Agenda.
 - Addition of 12.5 and 12.6
 - **Motion** to accept agenda by IPDG George Corrin seconded by CT Linda Vinette. No opposition. Carried by all.
8. District Governor's Remarks
 - Membership is our main challenge and that is our main focus. Membership is supported by service and there are things happening as there were 3 members inducted in Brantford. On August 14th 3 new members were inducted into the Guelph Royal City Lions. IPDG Georg Corrin will be inducting new members shortly. We have also had the Freelon Lions Club join our District. They came over from A711. The DG expressed his appreciation to IPDG George Corrin for orchestrating the move of this club. We also have a new club, the Wilmot Lion/Lioness club and comprises of the former New Hamburg Lions and former New



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Hamburg Lioness and the former St. Agatha Lions club and we are looking for great things from this club.

- A question from Lion Juan stating he has a small club and is asking for help to grow his club from the DG. The DG replied stating the Membership Task Force will be in touch with him in the very near future.

9. Approval of the last Cabinet Meeting minutes from June 25th, 2021 and ratification of actions from the last Cabinet of 2020/2021. (<http://a15lions.org/pages/Main/HomePage>)

- **Motion** to approve Cabinet Meeting Minutes by 1stVDG Tony Davidson seconded by IPDG George Corrin. No opposition. Carried by all.

10. Matters Arising From

10.1 Secretary's Report – CT Linda asked if the 30 days was flexible to submit her reports.

Yes, as her reports take time to create and submit. **Motion** to receive Secretary's report by 1stVDG Tony Davidson seconded by RC9 Victor Chaux. No opposition. Carried.

10.2 Treasurer's Report – CT asked for a Motion to accept the Cabinet financial reports, the budget for 2021/2022 and the reduction of membership dues and the credit of \$25.00 for leadership seminar. The **motion** was seconded by RC9 Victor Chaux. PDDG George Patton questioned the Treasurer's assessment that policy determines what the Convention Levy is as in the By-Laws section 10 and it says that the levy shall be a \$1.40. It has not been levied in a couple of years. We could have a motion today to rebate \$.40 of this dollar but the assessment is breaking By-Law by not levying the \$1.40. The response from the Treasurer was past history showed it was at a \$1.00 so a motion was brought forward to do a credit of \$.40 and change the budget to reflect this.

The original **motion** was **amended** to reflect the changes to the financial budget to show the \$.40 reduction. Therefore, the total rebate will be \$2.40. This amended motion was seconded by RC9 Victor Chaux. No opposition. Carried by all.

11. 3 Cabinet Reports –

- **Motion** to accept Cabinet reports by 1stVDG Tony Davidson seconded by George Corrin. No opposition. Carried by all.
- A comment was made by GMT Denis asking if it was an omission or a rational error, as it appeared that none of the Cabinet reports were distributed prior to the meeting especially the Treasurer's report which would have provided some clarity for people prior to the meeting. Therefore, he recommended that all Cabinet reports along with the agenda should be distributed sometime before the meeting. If this is a change in the policy or the



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procedure for Cabinet, then he would remove his suggestion. The DG replied stating it was an excellent suggestion.

- The Cabinet Secretary responded by stating she received one report from her email request dated August 6th at 13:26, from ZC9E Janet Dawson Brock and did not distribute one document as it will be going in the minutes. The second report was from LCIF Peter Oswald and he distributed his own report to everyone. There has been no change in the policy or procedure as was communicated in the Secretary's report. The concern for not distributing the Cabinet Treasure's reports and allowing people to view prior to the meeting was uncalled for as they indeed were distributed Saturday August 7th at 18:01pm to the entire Cabinet.

12. Committee Reports

12.1 LCIF - Peter Oswald – his report attached below.

- Question from the Lion Jack – The consent form to complete and send to LCIF to allow a transfer from personal credits to our own club? Lion Peter will reach out to LCIF and get back to Lion Jack.

12.2 Gift of Life - Jessica Bailey

- Jess is a member of the Kitchener Pioneer Lions Club and is a double-kidney transplant recipient. DG inducted Lion Jess and her husband Lion James into their club about 3 years ago. Jess came up with this program to have people start thinking about becoming a donor or have current recipients thinking about their donor organ. Her program goal is for Lions to sign up to be a donor. This goal includes having each Lions club reaching an 80% sign up rate. If the club obtains this 80% goal, they will receive the programs patch. On this patch the club will receive a ribbon, to be placed on the patch for each year they maintain this 80% donor registration for up to 10 years. - Question from Lion Ted – the link on the District website would link to a district donor page. He would like to get this to a more specific page. Lion Ted and Lion Jess will work together to clarify this link.

12.3 Accessibility Awareness – IPDG George Corrin

- This committee is a four-year plan and is collaborating at the MDA level. It started last year with Lion Jim Saunders and Lion Ted Rypma and we have a local website. The intent of our program is to bring awareness to all clubs in District A15 and to identify and possibly remove the barriers where we can. We also want to remove the obstacles that stand in the way of the person who has disabilities from being able to access facilities and information. A barrier is defined as anything that prevents a person with a disability from fully participating in all aspects of society because of a disability. As DG Harvey stated it goes beyond stairs and elevators. Today, it will be brief but be



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documented. It will include environmental barriers, building for spaces that will restrict or impede physical access. It is not just wheelchair access. It will include movement disorders such as scooter, crutches, canes or just holding on to someone's arm. The communication barriers are obstacles such as processing or transmitting information. For example, if we print on a brochure that is too small to read or documents that are not available with alternative formats in our district it would not be accessible to the visually impaired. Another large component of this is called, (inaudible) it is the prejudgement or assumptions that directly or indirectly discriminate. For example that all visually impaired people can read brail. Or if a person is wearing hearing aids they can hear everything and that is not possible. The document that will be used for the next four years is called Accessibility for Ontarians with a Disability and was produced in 2005 and will conclude with all of the people in Ontario following the legislation that has been put through. We use the acronym AODA as it is a lot easier to say. At the MDA level we are at the point of creating a booklet that will be distributed to all District Governors so they can see how the 10 districts are working together. In District A15 we have 55 clubs. Some of our clubs own their own buildings and the committee hopes to assist them when they may need to improve their facility to meet the needs for people with disabilities. The Thamesford Lions renovated their community arena washroom and is now passed wheelchair accessibility and also improved their sound system for the hearing impaired. No obstacles to prevent anyone from entering the building.

- Lion Ted pointed out on the District website under the Administration headline there is a resource to this AODA.

- Gate posts are almost constructed. PCC Todd is doing a wonderful job.

12.2 Update from PDG Tim DeBlock regarding Vision Screening

- PDG Tim is going to make Vision Screening happen in the Waterloo Education system.

12.3 Update on District Directory

- Directory will be going to the press Monday August 16th, 2021. Very big job. Thanks to CS Debbie, Lion Ted and Lion Brian. It will be in hard copy and sent out to the clubs and on the District website.

12.4 Interclub Visitations

- The DG encourages these visits to find new friends and learn what other clubs do. Enjoy the commodore and fellowship that these visits bring.

12.5 Art Woods Golden Tree Award

- 1stVDG Tony communicated to the group that earlier this summer a comprehensive report was received from a fellow member to re-purpose 'The Art Woods Golden Tree Award'. This report has been taken to a committee for its relevancy. There will be a report provided in the very near future.

12.6 2-Day Convention Update

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- DG is hoping for a “live” convention. PDDG George Patton is the Convention Chair this year. The date is April 9th and 10th, 2022 and will be held at the Crown Plaza Hotel in Kitchener. The planning has begun and as per George Patton. There will be a budget proposal communicated at the October 28th Cabinet meeting. The changes to the policy that were passed in June lay out what the schedule will be with the exception of any changes made by the DG. Stay tuned for further details! There will be extra security for Tracey’s room!

14. New Business

- GMT Denis had a meeting planned Tuesday August 17th, 2021 for the Membership Task Force. He would like to defer this to the evening of August the 31st, 2021. This may be something new for some of the members of Cabinet, but would like to reach out to all Lions and invite all members to attend the Membership Task Force with the objective of creating new clubs. Also, leveraging service is a primary motivator for membership.
- Lion O.J. wanted to remind all clubs not to forget to enter your service activities in MyLCI under your club. LCI has \$500.00 per district to give away and only 28% of the districts in Canada applied for this. With the exception of the Cabinet Treasurer, approximately one month prior to every Cabinet meeting each member of Cabinet, the GAT and Committee Chairs are to submit a report to the Cabinet Secretary.

Your document must be written and sent in Word. The reason for this is to allow the document to be transposed into the Cabinet minutes. The Cabinet minutes are to be clear and maintained on a certain type of font and a certain sized font. When you send your document in a 'pdf' it cannot be changed. You have to have a certain type of Adobe software which cost an annual fee and I do not subscribe to this.

Approximately, 10 days prior to the Cabinet meeting the Cabinet Secretary sends out the agenda along with everyone's reports for review. This time allows for questions and or concerns to be brought forward.

These questions and concerns are then voiced at the Pre-Cabinet meeting which is usually a date within a week prior to the Cabinet meeting. The pre-cabinet meeting is strictly for Cabinet only.

Please note, should the Cabinet Secretary receive reports after the agenda has been distributed to all parties, she/he will not be sending them out as it creates too many emails for everyone to keep receiving.

All Cabinet meetings are recorded on a digital recorder. Minutes are taken from this device.

Due to the By-Laws being updated this past April 2021 at Convention the Cabinet Secretary must distribute the minutes within 15 days of the Cabinet Meeting.

In conclusion, I would like to ask for everyone's awareness of trying to eliminate email strings. You do not always have to reply to everyone in an original email.

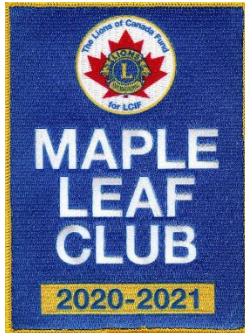

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2) Reward & Recognition

Clubs that have achieved Maple Leaf Club status will be receiving a Banner patch and certificate.



The MODEL CLUBS will receive a framed certificate. I would prefer to hold these until we can meet in person but they will be distributed this year.

A key element of LCIF donations is that they accumulate toward **Melvin Jones Fellowships (MJF)**. For every US\$1,000 that is donated, one MJF may be requested. With the amount of donations over the past few years, several Clubs have quite a number of MJFs built up. The Clubs combined have a total of 216 MJFs available! Please consider awarding a fellowship to a deserving Lion or member of the community. It is quite likely that a special MJF Day will be held later this year – most likely in January in recognition of Melvin Jones’ birthday. So, plan now and get those MJFs in place and all of the recent MJF recipients will be recognized as a group. A District in Saskatchewan awarded 62 MJFs last year – how many can District A-15 issue this year?

Also, Clubs that donated more than US \$5,000 last year as well as the District (cumulative donations were over US\$10,000) will qualify for a Community Impact Grant THIS year. The Grant amount will be formally communicated in the near future. More information will be provided but we should all be considering projects and plans where this money could be used to support a cause under the LCIF pillars (Environment, Diabetes, Childhood Cancer, Vision, Youth, Disaster Relief, Humanitarian Needs, or Hunger). We get something back for giving!

3) Rededicate Support

One More Year! Clubs – as fundraising can restart, please consider a donation to LCIF. A few Clubs are close to Maple Leaf Club status and may just need a little push to reach that level. I will be in touch directly with information. A few Clubs may want to award a MJF but don’t have US \$1,000 in donations. Make a donation now to get over that threshold!
