





drink to each person and promoted the benefits of Lions service. The day was a resounding success as


we also gained 2 new members to our Lions Club.



ROCKTON LIONS
















The Galt-Cambridge Lions have a long standing tradition of Community Support and presence, they are involved in many community events such as the annual Canada Parade. They have made meaningful donations to local and national

DRUMBO LIONS

At it's June 2020 meeting, the Drumbo Lions committed to donating a minimum of \$300 each year for the next 10 years to the Save The Evidence Campaign of the Woodland Cultural Centre in Brantford. The Save The Evidence Campaign is a movement to restore and preserve the Mohawk Institute, a former Indigenous Residential School in Brantford. The goal is to restore the building so it can become a healing centre, museum,



and education centre for everyone to learn about Residential Schools. School children will be able to visit and learn about this aspect of our history.

The donation will be made each year in June during National Indigenous History month; at which time members of the community will be invited to contribute along with the Lions Club, either to the Lions as part of their donation or directly to the Save The Evidence Campaign. This year, 2021, the Lions received a matching community donation of \$300, so that the total donation coming from the Lions Club was \$600.

The Drumbo Lions Club feel that, as community leaders, we need to model reconciliation and this yearly donation is one piece of the work we can do. We challenge other Lions Clubs and community service groups to also consider what they will do for reconciliation.


