shows that success does come from planning and execution.


We ask that this be distributed to your club members for their review. The example provides a good number of the ideas that could go into your plan.





We wish everyone a Merry Christmas and the Healthiest and Happiest of New Years.




### BELWOOD & DISTRICT K.W. COMMUNITY SPIRIT


### LION DON GAMBLE GALT-CAMBRIDGE LIONS



### COPETOWN LIONS PEACE POSTER CONTEST




