

As always, PID Art Woods did a masterful job with the induction of the new cabinet!














### THAMESFORD LIONS





## KITCHENER PIONEER LIONS

One of the newer initiatives of the Thamesford Lions Parks & Environment committee this year was to establish a "Pollinator Garden" at in North Park. Working in equal financial partnership with the Upper Thames River Conservation Authority(UTRCA), the Lions began preparation last fall at a location chosen in the North Park. This spring,

Lions completed preparation of the site and with guidance from Linda Smith & Kim Gilbert of UTRCA, members of the Thamesford Girl Guides troop and the Lions completed the planting

At the same time last fall, Zorra Township made plans to establish a second garden located near the entrance sign at the Lions



River Park on the other side of the village. The township totally covered the cost of this project and worked with UTRCA, who once again selected and guided the planting of that garden this spring.
