

PID Lion Art Woods conducted the service.







BUILD YOUR TEAM





Where there is a need there is a Lion, But, If there are no Lions the needs can not be fulfilled.

The first step in the Global Membership process is to form a team. In most clubs the membership team is the Membership chair, but it needs to be a team. Large enough to be vibrant but small enough to be nimble. A team of 3-5 members is the ideal number. Sometimes we think that the whole club should be on the team, but it is difficult to come up with a consensus for a membership plan. At the same time all club members need to agree that there is need to add members.

Jim Collins in his book Good to Great says there are two parts to a great team.

- 1. First it needs to have a leader who is ambitious first and foremost for the cause, the organization, the work not themselves- and they have the fierce resolve to do whatever it takes to make good on that ambition.
- 2.Second, those that build great teams make sure they have the right people on the bus, the wrong people off the bus, and the right people in the key seats before they figure out where to drive the bus.

Last week the District had 2 membership work shops. Besides the facilitators, 23 Lions took time out of their schedule to attend one or both workshops. We thank you for stepping up and wanting to make a difference. There were 19 clubs represented.

The Kitchener Pioneer Lions Club learned that the CNIB Lake Joseph Centre (CNIB Lake Joe camp) has started a campaign to raise funds for a new minibus.

Their present buses are not new and are becoming less reliable..

When the club found out about the campaign, one of the minibuses was actually out of commission, which increased the transportation challenges of the season. We know the special magic camp brings to so many people from coast to coast, which includes campers from the Waterloo Region area. If campers cannot get to camp, they cannot experience the magic of camp,



which includes missing out on all the fun, skills learning and friendships that will last a lifetime. The camp buses also provide transportation to off-site programs, which opens up more events and opportunities for all that camp has to offer.



The campaign's goal is to raise \$160,000 for a new minibus that will provide reliable, safe, accessible and comfortable transportation for campers. Kitchener Pioneer Lions Club has donated the first \$1,000 to the new Lions' Minibus campaign for CNIB Lake Joe to start of the campaign. Chris Duncan (past president) is calling on his fellow Lions to contribute to this

minibus campaign and to help spread the word. "I'm super excited about stirring up competition with other Lions Clubs to match/beat my donation and perhaps having an incentive for clubs to donate \$1K each."



Past President Erhard Kruger, Lions Club of Kitchener was recently presented with two awards by the Society for Creative Anachronism. The first for his many


