

Get ready for the new Lion Portal

Evolving the Lion Digital Experience

from PDG Lion O.J. Wilura

- MyLion, MyLCl and Insights, along with some additional tools and functionalities will be combined into a unified experience called the Lion Portal. The new portal will offer the same features and functionality currently available, but with a more consistent and efficient experience.
- Launching targeting is mid-2023 launch. A preview of the system will be offered prior to the launch.
- Current Lion Account passwords are encrypted. This means we cannot see them or port them over into a new system. Because of this, you will prompt to update your Lion Account credentials — your username and password — to access the Lion Portal.
- The new system will not support the use of telephone numbers as usernames, so you will need to use a <u>unique email</u> — one that is <u>only</u> <u>used by you</u> — and create a new password to log in. This is for privacy compliance, shared passwords will not be allowed.
- Access to various functions will be directly from the homepage. For example, rather than clicking into MyLion to report your service, you'll access service reporting directly from the main portal page.
- In addition to reporting service, managing club rosters, accessing reports and all the other functionality you currently have through MyLion, MyLCI and Insights, the new Lion Portal will provide a centralized location to access a variety of data and tools ranging from your LCIF donation history to our Member Service Center

Get ready for the new Lion Portal

Evolving the Lion Digital Experience

- MyLion, MyLCI and Insights as you know them today will not be available once the new Lion Portal is live. However, the same functionality of those tools will be available. The functions will no longer be housed within separate tools.
- Whether using your desktop, laptop, tablet or mobile phone, you'll have access to the same functionality in the Lion Portal.
 The portal will simply be adjusted to fit the size of the device.
- The new system is built on Salesforce, which offers Salesforce Shield — an extremely powerful and secure suite of data-privacy and encryption tools.
- The Lion Portal will include in-product training at launch so you can learn while exploring the updated experience.
- Just as it is today, your access to specific data and tools is based on any Lions positions you hold.
- It is imperative that Club Secretaries or Administrators start ensuring member's email addresses are correct, Club Officers information needs to added for upcoming next fiscal year on MyLCI immediately after the club elections. The same is needed for District Officers with submission of the Convention Report and the District Cabinet Officers Report directly following their conventions.
- Emails being used now by members <u>must be the same</u> as recorded on MyLCI
- Lions not registered when the new system is launched can do so, more than likely in September, as priority will be given to the current registered Lions.



A NEW YEAR'S RESOLUTION





I read an article by Yael Splansky who is the senior rabbi of Holy Blossom Temple, Toronto's first synagogue. He recommends everyone's New Years's resolution should be to volunteer for one hour. I know, about now you are all thinking "yes Lions Garry we know this. You are preaching to the converted." But before you turn the page, what would happen if we asked people to volunteer one hour rather than ask them to be a Lion member. We all know about that "life-affirming" feeling that we could create in other people by just asking them to volunteer.

What would happen if you had a 100 volunteers for one hour? You could clean up 50 kms of highway, pick garbage in every park in your city, go door to door and collect a months worth of food for a food bank, or drive 50 patients to their cancer treatment appointments.

What do you need to make that happen....service projects. Create the projects and ask people to help. The one of many things we learned going to busiinesses in Listowel is citizens want to help. Do not ask them to be a Lion ask them to volunteer. They will want to become a lion after they see the great work that we do.

On August 17, 1961, CNIB Lake Joe, the only accessible camp of its kind in Canada, opened its doors to campers with sight loss for the very first time. CNIB is grateful to Lions – the Knights of the Blind – for helping CNIB secure this piece of paradise on Lake Joseph, and for tirelessly serving as valued volunteers, generous donors, and dedicated advocates.

As we celebrate warm memories of the past 60 years, we are building a bright future for generations to come! With the support of our dedicated Lions, we are smashing barriers to ensure that everyone who wants to attend CNIB Lake Joe can do so.

One of our most urgent capital needs is to replace our aging minibuses. We are seeking Lions' support to raise \$160,000 for a new minibus to provide reliable, safe, accessible and comfortable transportation for campers. Everyone impacted by sight loss – adults, children & youth, and families – should be able to access life-changing programs at CNIB Lake Joe. In the words of Lion Peter Best, "If they can't get there, they can't benefit."

Get involved now! \$1,000 from each Lions Club can make this dream come true. Once \$80K has been raised, an application will be made to the **Lions Club International Foundation for a matching grant.** Visit **cnib.ca/LakeJoeMinibus** for full details and to donate.

One camper explains why CNIB Lake Joe is so important to her: "CNIB Lake Joe feels like home. It's the only place where I don't have to explain myself or my disability. It's the only place where I have been encouraged to try new things I never thought I would be able to do. Lake Joe is the place that has made me begin to believe that I can dream."

Sadly, many people with sight loss miss out on transformative experiences at Lake Joe because they simply can't get to camp. But, as Knights of the Blind, Lions can change that!






DUNDAS LIONS - HOLIDAYS AND HANDBAGS
