It's *"FORSURE"* Lions of MDA and Canada and elsewhere in Lions International, either know or have heard of PID Art Woods, those of us that know him are better for it.

We know Art tries to avoid the limelight but he has received numerous awards including the 100% Club President's Award, a Membership Key Award, a 100% District Governor's Award, multiple International President's and Leadership



Awards and the Ambassador of Good Will Award. He is also a life member of the Elmira Lions Club, a Judge Brian Stevenson Fellow and a Progressive Melvin Jones Fellow, He also has received a International Directors Recognition award and last but not least a Lions Foundation of Canada Patron award. Notwithstanding his feelings, he deserves to be recognized with his accomplishments.



Art has long been a strong supporter of the Lions Foundation of Canada(LFC), quite a few years back he initiated the concept of a Memorial Forest to honour past Lions. This became a reality and now serves as a model for Lions Clubs across Canada and elsewhere. The forest is firmly established on the property of the

Lions Foundation Breeding Facility in Breslau Ontario. It is well know in Lionism throughout North America and has been a destination for International Lions Presidents, including our present Leader Lion Brian Sheehan. Lion Art himself has been a contributor to the foundation and has been successful in obtaining major donations. A case in point was a major donation that amounted to over \$1,000,000.00, a lasting legacy which will be a huge benefit to the foundation and the Memorial Forest.



Lion Art has a special place in his heart for PDG Larry Wainwright, his wife Hilda and their Dog Guide, Otis. Larry is blind and is an advocate for the foundation, all three of them have raised thousands of dollars through participation in the Dog Walk events for LFC. It was Larry who started the ball rolling with the fellowship and followed it through to fruition. The foundation in their wisdom decided it was time for Art to be recognized in a

special way for his efforts. The project was unveiled at the District A-2 Convention in St. Catharines on March 25th. It was only appropriate that Art was the first recipient. Bev Crandell, Chief Executive Officer of LFC made the presentation.



The fellowship recognizes the commitment, dedication and 50 years of service of PID Art and his passion for the environment and LFCDG's Memorial Forest, funds from this fellowship will be directed to a dedicated garden space at the new training school. The process takes about 3 hours so it could be done over a couple of meetings or perhaps a designated time such as a Saturday morning. Similar to most good meetings, through this process, the club will leave with realistic goals and action plans.

The boys and I know what the end result of the bike ride will be. By following our route, the boys and I know that we will have fun arriving home with wet pants and shoes from racing through water and muddy

hollows. In the same way, clubs will experience hills, valleys and perhaps some muddy patches. However, we can have the confidence that the GMA process will result in increased membership.



I know you from my own experience you will enjoy the process and please celebrate your success. The same as I know the boys and I will enjoy the bike ride and maybe we will celebrate our success by Nana having home made treats for the boys and perhaps a shot of whiskey for Grandpa.


