

# MISSION1.5



What is Mission 1.5? It is our latest International Membership growth initiative. I am sure some of our more senior members are rolling their eyes and saying to themselves, "we have seen this before". So, what is different about Mission 1.5? As a member for 25 years, this is the first time we I have

seen a membership goal set with a time frame.1.5 million members by July 2027. This means that we require a 10% increase in membership. Our district requires a net increase of 133 members by 2027. In the past 5 years our district has lost an average of 164 members annually. Therefore, we will need to add 164 plus 44 members for a total of 208 each year. Let's break that down to the club level. For example, the Guelph Lions club has 20 members. On average the club will lose 10% of its membership each year. So in order to meet its's goal of 22 members by 2027, it will need to add 8 members over the next 3 years or an average of almost 3 members per year.

How do we accomplish a net 10% increase in membership by 2027?

- Add service projects that involve interacting with your community. Everyone you meet through a Club service project is a potential member.
- Just ask people to be a member.
- Have projects ready for new members and for those that wish to volunteer.
- Market your club. Have a marketing chair.
- Ask for help. You have a great cabinet team that are wiling to provide hands on support.




# **STRATFORD LIONS**


