am the Lions Quest chairperson for A15. I was fortunate to spend a weekend together with other Chairs from across the country. As a result I have a much clearer idea as to what Lions Quest is all about and why it is a program we all should support.

Lions Quest is a social emotional learning program for children and youth to promote schools as safe places of learning, support and development for all children. In schools that use this program there are many positive indications of its success - improved marks, greater unity and respect, less violence,

bullying and overall an enhanced sense of community.

Supporting Lions Quest has two main parts. One is financially and the other is by introducing and supporting the program in our schools. I am asking you to consider making a donation, if you haven't already, and encourage you to do so annually. There are easy ways to do within your Club if there is not room in the budget.

Step Up For Kids is a program that involves individuals or Clubs supporting a Lion or a Team of Lions to walk for kids. It has been extended until the end of October - your Club members could form a team, register on the website and others can donate through the link on the Lions Quest website. I have formed a team with Lion Cheryl Hewitson and we have committed to walk a minimum of 75 kilometres by the end of October. We have a link to Step Up For Kids as well as a sign up sheet for donations on the Lions Quest website, lionsquest.ca. We keep our Club advised of our progress and accept donations in cash at meetings if that is easier. Receipts are available for donations of \$20. or more. Any Club or individual or group can do the same. Of course you are welcome to support Lion Cheryl and I! Our Team is called "Happy Walkers."

You can also identify a school in your community that you would like to introduce the Lions Quest program to. In this case an experienced Lion can work with you to plan the introduction.

Most Courses range from fifteen to 30 minutes. If you do not complete the course in one sitting, when you log back on, you wil be returned to the place where you left off.

Taking the on-line courses will greatly assist you in developing your overall leadership skills.

is looking after our Facebook page and has advanced to be 1st vice president.




posters in a variety of local businesses, we


