

#### Floradale Friends of Dog Guides





Across MDA Lions Quest Child Identification Kits program Iis a resounding success, helping to ensure the safety of children in our communities. Lions have taken proactive steps to distribute kits at various events, sharingl resources with parents and caregivers. The stories highlight incredible efforts of clubs demonstrating the impact this initiative is having on families and the positive feedback received from grateful community members. Here's how some of our clubs have been engaging their communities through the ID Kits program.



The **St. Thomas Lions** have found great opportunities to distribute Child ID kits since purchasing them. They sponsored a free skating event, where they handed out kits to over 100 skaters, along with information about the club. During March Break, they sponsored a free mini-golf event at the Elgin Mall, where

129 golfers participated, and we provided ID kits to children under 12. Additionally, they took part in the St. Thomas Optimist Family Fun Day and distributed the kits there as well.

The **Lions Club of Sault Ste. Marie** distributed Child ID kits to St. Paul Elementary School for their "Welcome to Kindergarten" event in May. The kits were included in packages given to incoming parents.





**Gananoque Lions** have distributed the ID kits at various events, including Ribfest, Lions Car Show, Pet Value Walk for Dog Guides and Pump-Gan-Fest. Some members have handed them out to friends and family with small children.

On April 20th, **London East Lions** participated in Earth Fest, focused on environmental awareness in London. As environmental stewardship is one of the Lions' core values, they set up an information booth. Initially, people were hesitant, thinking they were asking for donations, but once they began approaching parents with children, explaining the purpose of the kits and how to use them, the



response was overwhelmingly positive. Parents praised the Lions for this important service, and by the end of the day, they had distributed 90 kits and received heartfelt thanks for our contribution to community safety.

The **Chippawa Lions** distributed Child ID kits to the community during the Firefighter's Car Show on Saturday, June 29th.

**KW Community Spirit Lions** distributed kits at a Family Skate event and a Bike Rally in May. A member purchased them for her business to distribute at a community event.

These stories reflect the Lions' ongoing dedication to community safety and well-being through the Child ID Kit initiative. 
# COPETOWN-LYNDEN LIONS &

## LYNDEN LIONS


